


Demographics, households, and homeownership

- Young people form households, feed homeownership
 - 15-34: Household formation begins and reaches maximum acceleration
 - 25-44: Transition to homeownership begins and reaches maximum acceleration
- Older adults exit from households, homeownership
 - 55-64: More household "exits" than "entries"
 - 65 onward: Accelerating exits




Household change by birth decade, 1990-2030 (observed & projected)





Homeowner change by birth decade, 1990-2030 (observed & projected)




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Non-whites are critical to current and future household formation...



Map portrays ratio of seniors exiting homeownership to young people entering




Hispanics in 1990: Mostly in traditional gateways

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Great Lakes & Northeast Baby Boomer transition: Crisis or opportunity?

- Recent diverse growth can make the difference—but only if young people stay.

 - Creating living-wage jobs in senior care (accelerating 2020-25)
 - Incentivizing retrofits of existing housing for safe, comfortable aging in place
